Philanthropy in HK (History)


- Probably existed when human civilization first appeared in HK 5000 years ago

- Community Chest 1968


HK comparing to US/Canada

- US: about 1.8% of GDP (1999)
- Canada: about 0.5% of GDP (1998)
- HK: about 0.2% of GDP (1998)

(Golin/Harris Forrest, 2001)


- (in HK about 60% of those with earnings do not have to pay tax, but they donate)
- (not all who donate, claim tax exemption)
- (many donations cannot claim tax, e.g. flag selling)






Landscape of Giving

- 86% of adult have giving experience to charities.
- Median HK\$800 a year, average HK\$2,986 a year.
- 11% of donors do have planned giving.
- 59% give on streets, 35% gives thro banks
- Cause: relief related causes (35%), children (20%), elders (16%), disabled (11%), health and medical (10%), poverty alleviation (6%), education (3%)





Factors affecting philanthropy in HK in the past decade

- Increasing number of charities
- Increasing fund raising activities
- The promotion and development of CSR
