- Mind set limited by too many rules and guidelines
- The world keeps changing



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The roles of NGO in the future

- Choice of service users [money-follows-user 錢跟人 走], NGO need to reform and strike for excellence;
- Change of the ratio in subvented and non-subvented services;
- The top management of NGOs need business management knowledge and skills to run the services;
- NGO back to the basic, to provide service with its own resources;
- More direct keen competition and collaboration between NGO, SE and the commercial sector.
