

Sources of Information



• High quality clearinghouses

An evidence-based clearinghouse is an Internetbased site (portal, database) that aims to make accessible information on evidence-based interventions in human services to an group of users.



Quick History

- Historically, the idea of evidence-based clearinghouse has its origins in the development of web-based databases which have been around for decades.
- They have been growing increasingly sophisticated, especially for the last 6-8 years.

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Quick History

• The word "clearinghouse" is borrowed from financial systems where financial transactions gather on one place (for example a national central bank), are controlled and cleared, and transferred to receivers.

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









Scientific Rating Scale | 12 University of Southern California

Organization

- Organizational Culture –norms, values, behavioral expectations
- Organizational climate –perceptions and affective responses to work environment, job characteristics

Would What Works in California Work in Hong Kong?? Transportability!

Country-Level Variables

- Political variables, e. g. locus of social service agencies
- Social, educational, historical variables, e.g. appropriateness of stating opinions
- Geo-economic variables, e.g. disparities
- Social problem variables, e. g. centrality of certain social and mental health problems
