




Objectives








- 1st stakeholder dialogue forum on EIA in HK.
- 1st networking-cum-training workshop on cross-boundary issues for ENGOs based in Guangdong and HK.







Impacts

- Raised awareness of the importance of public participation in the early stages of the EIA process
 - Partly resulted in the most detailed Study Brief in the history of EIA in HK-for the production of EIA report for "Expansion of Hong Kong International Airport into a Three-Runway System"
- Gathered and consolidated views from various stakeholder groups on HK's EIA process
- Capacity-building through forums with government representatives, academics, professionals and ENGOs
- Facilitated a joint submission by local ENGOs, to the Government, on a review of Hong Kong's EIA process
