



How it benefited grassroots women's organizations

- Reveal + resolve concerns → encourage them to conduct social research.
 - Research with limited resources and validity **→** Useless?
 - What if research results that are not beneficial to policy advocacy?
 - How to promote complex concepts? (e.g. Gender budgeting)
- Maximizing effects of social research conducted by small size NGOs



Difficulties encountered

- Target audiences were not well served
- → Low participation from grassroots women organizations
 - Diverse background
 - Difficult to conduct workshops to satisfy all WCEO members
 - Activities overload
 - How to tackle: tailor-made to specific target groups, transportation allowance, promotion
