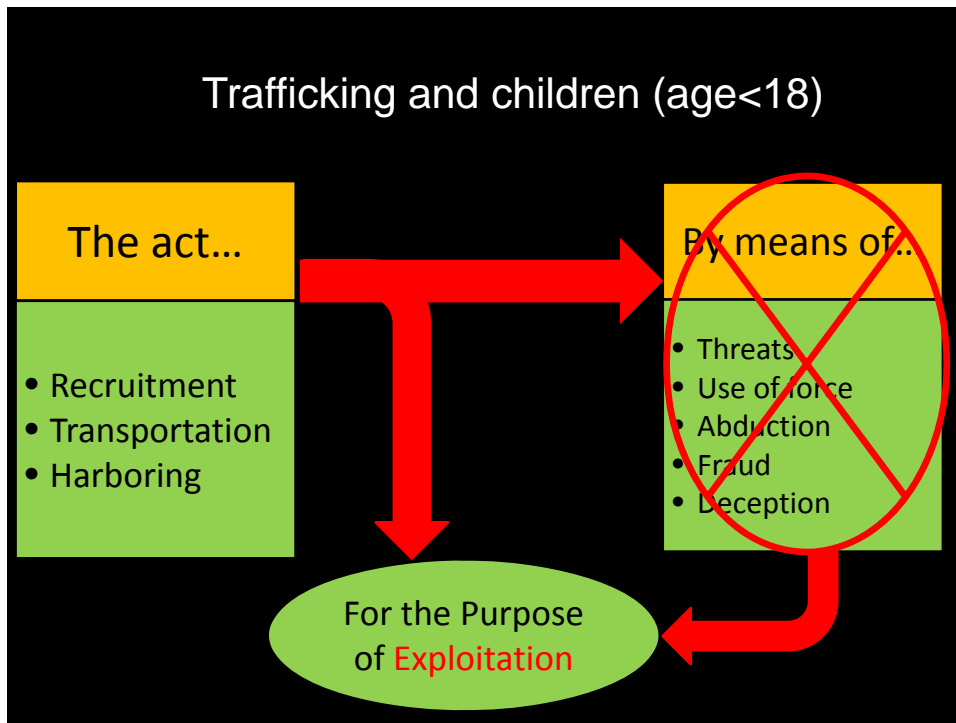


**Fact:** Over 25 percent of slaves are below the age of 18

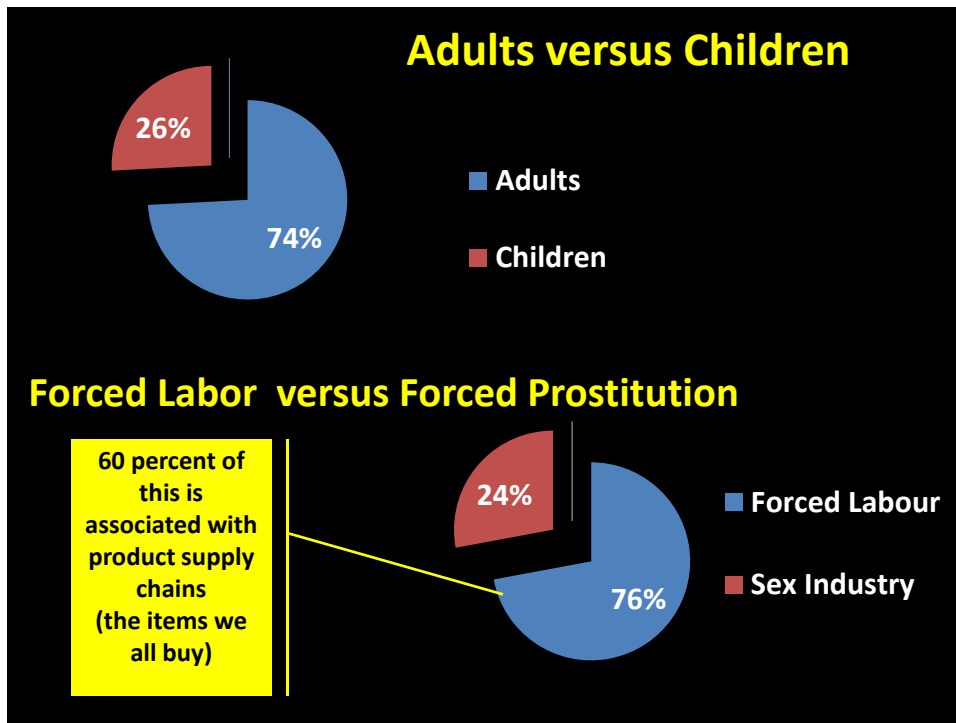


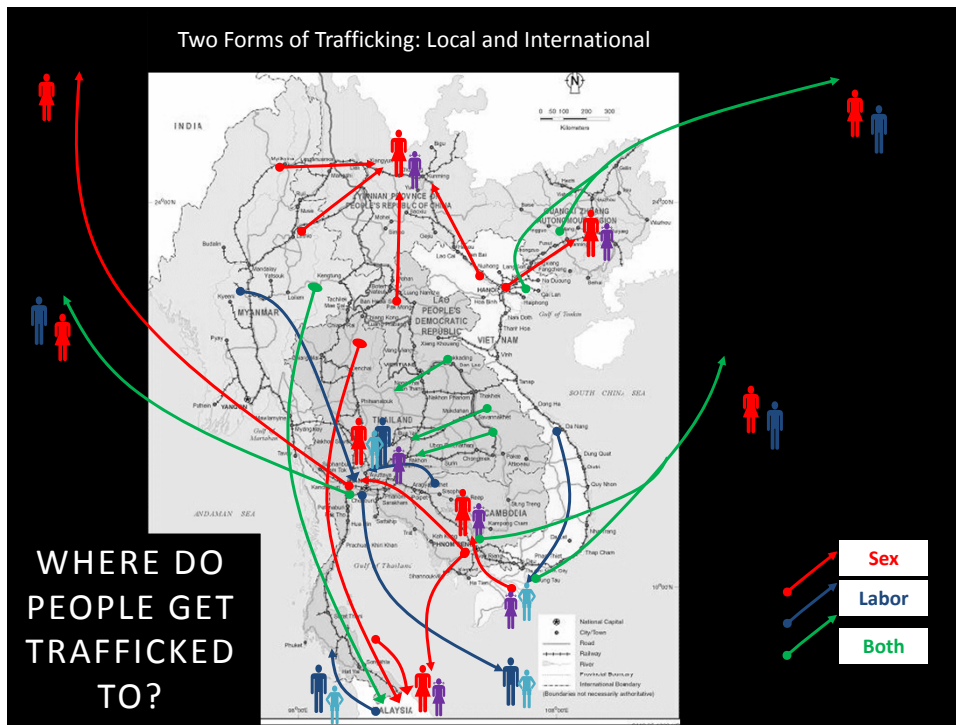

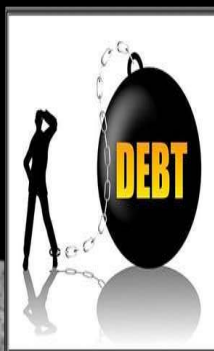

## Regional Migrant Hotline Concept

- **Goal:** One easy to remember phone number for the entire region – e.g. 555
- **Cost:** A “local call” for the caller from anywhere in the Mekong region (China, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam)
- **Service:** Advice, guidance and referrals provided in their own language
- **Options:**
  - Encourage calls to existing hotlines (when in country)
  - Regional calls put through a dedicated call center when multi-countries involved

## China

- Cases found in:
  - Sex industry
  - Forced labor
  - Domestic Servitude
  - Bride trafficking -- Gender imbalance is a social time bomb (by 2020 a shortage of marriageable women)
- Definition different from other countries
- National plan of action in place – law being reviewed now
- Main players in addressing rescues are government and Christian groups

## Hong Kong

- Cases found in:
  - Sex industry
  - Domestic Servitude
  - Bride trafficking
- Limited Arrests and Prosecutions
- Limited social services
- Law and Operational Plan absent
- Limited understanding of the problem at all levels
