Religion and Clinical Practice: The Experience of Two Hong Kong Social Workers in Urban South India

Missionaries in developing countries have always been associated with evangelism and charity. What alternatives do they have when they are at the same time practicing social workers? How do Chinese social workers respond to the needs of individuals and communities in urban South India? What can we learn about ourselves and purpose of life when we get involved in cross-cultural work? Reflections on integration issues and intervention models will also be discussed.
