Professor Peggy Levitt is Professor of Sociology in the Department of Sociology at the Wellesley College. She is an Associate at the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University where she co-directs The Politics and Social Change Workshop. She is co-founder of the Global (De) Centre (with Maurice Cruil) and a Robert Schuman Fellow at European University Institute (2017-2019). Professor Levitt received honorary doctoral degrees from the University of Maastricht in 2014 and from the University of Helsinki in 2017.

Professor Levitt's research interests include global arts and culture, museums, international migration, transnational relations and processes, development, and religion.
