Biography

Professor Bruce Dickson is a Professor of Political Science and International Affairs and Director of the Sigur Center for Asian Studies at the George Washington University.

Professor Dickson research and teaching focus on political dynamics in China, especially the adaptability of the Chinese Communist Party and the regime it governs. His current research examines the political consequences of economic reform in China, the Chinese Communist Party's evolving strategy for survival, and the changing relationship between state and society. His research has been supported by the National Science Foundation, the Smith Richardson Foundation, the US Institute of Peace, and the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars.

Professor Dickson's articles have appeared in *Asian Survey*, *China Quarterly*, *Comparative Politics*, *Comparative Political Studies*, *Journal of Contemporary China*, *Journal of Democracy*, *National Interest*, and *Political Science Quarterly*. He is a frequent commentator on political developments in China and Taiwan and on U.S.-China relations, and has appeared on CNN, NPR, BBC, and VOA.
