She has also held senior staff positions at the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank. Christine's research focuses on China's public finance and public sector reform. Over the past fifteen years she has worked extensively in advisory capacities, for the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank, as well as through consultancies for the OECD, UNDP, UNICEF, and DFID.
