Biography

Professor Kjeld Erik Brødsgaard is Professor and Director of the Asia Research Centre, Copenhagen Business School. He has held visiting research appointments in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Taiwan, and the US. He is member of the International Advisory Board of the East Asian Institute, National University of Singapore; member of the Board of Nordic Institute of Asian Studies (NIAS); member of the Board of Sino-Danish Centre for Education and Research; and member of the Board of the Asia House Foundation. He is also a Non-resident Professor at the Institute of Public Policy, South China University of Technology, and an Honorary Research Fellow at the Research Centre for Contemporary China, School of Government, Peking University.

Professor Brødsgaard is member of the editorial board of a number of scholarly journals and the founding Editor of *The Copenhagen Journal of Asian Studies*. He has published more than 20 books, including *Bringing the Party Back In: How China is Governed* (2004); *The Chinese Communist Party in Reform* (2006, and 2009); *Hainan – State, Society and Business in a Chinese Province* (2009; and 2013); *Globalization and Public Sector Reform in China* (2014); and *Chinese Politics as Fragmented Authoritarianism* (2016). His articles have appeared in *Asian Survey, The China Quarterly, Modern China, China: An International Journal, Issues and Studies, China Report,* and elsewhere. His research interests include state, party and public management in China; the civil service system and administrative reform; the nomenklatura system and cadre management; the structure and impact of Chinese business groups in China; and the rise of China's supermanagers.
