Kam Wing Chan is a Professor of Geography at University of Washington. His main research program focuses on the impact of social and political institutions on migration, urbanization and urban labor in China. He specializes in China's cities, migration, employment, the household registration system and related statistics. In recent years, he has served as a Consultant for the World Bank, United Nations, Asian Development Bank, and McKinsey & Co. on a number of policy projects related to China's cities and economy. He is the author of Cities with Invisible Walls: Reinterpreting Urbanization in Post-1949 China (Oxford University Press, 1994). His recent commentaries and interviews have appeared in the Wall Street Journal, New York Times, The Economist, China Daily, South China Morning Post, BBC, China Radio International, CBC Radio, Caixin, and other media in Asia and the USA.
