Biography

Mr Liu Zhi is Senior Fellow and China Program Director with the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy and Director of Peking University – Lincoln Institute Center for Urban Development and Land Policy. Prior to this, Mr Liu had been with the World Bank for 18 years, with operational experiences in East Asia, South Asia and Latin America. He managed a number of investment lending projects and economic sector studies in the infrastructure and urban sectors. In 2010, he served as vice chair of Global Agenda Council for the Future of Transportation, World Economic Forum. In 1993-94, he was a research associate with Harvard Institute for International Development. In 1985-87, he taught city and regional planning as a faculty member in Nanjing University. He has authored and co-authored a number of academic papers and World Bank reports on the topics of metropolitan infrastructure financing, low-carbon city development, sustainable urban transport, global motorization, public transport subsidies, and poverty. He holds BS from Dr Sun Yat-Sen University, MS from Nanjing University, and PhD from Harvard University.
