Biography

Professor Gary Hamilton is a Professor of The Jackson School of International Studies and holds a joint appointment in the Department of Sociology. He has received a number of honors, including a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Fulbright Fellowship and a Fellowship from The Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences.

Professor Hamilton specializes in historical/comparative sociology, economic sociology, and organizational sociology. He also specializes in Asian societies, with particular emphasis on East Asian societies. He is an author of numerous articles and books, including most recently *Emergent Economies, Divergent Paths, Economic Organization and International Trade in South Korea and Taiwan* (with Robert Feenstra) (Cambridge University Press, 2006), *Commerce and Capitalism in Chinese Societies* (London: Routledge, 2006), and *The Market Makers: How Retailers Are Changing the Global Economy* (co-editor and contributor, Oxford University Press, 2011; paperback 2012).
