Dr Kenneth Yuen is from the Neuroimaging Center (NIC) at Johannes Gutenberg University Mainz. He is a core research team member of the Mainz Resilience Project (MARP), and is actively involved in the EU Horizon 2010 project Dynamic Modelling of Resilience (DynaMore). He received his PhD in clinical psychology from the University of Hong Kong, and completed postdoctoral fellowships at the Wales Institute of Cognitive Neuroscience, University of Wales Bangor and at the Institute for Systems Neuroscience, University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf.

Dr Yuen specializes in cognitive-affective neuroscience research using neuroimaging techniques. His primary research interest lies in investigating the perception, appraisal, and regulation of affective information using a combined approach of functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI), physiological measurements and computation modelling. He is also interested in the interactions between affective states and a wide variety of cognitive operations, including decision-making, time perception and psychological resilience.
