

Abstract

Ngaire Woods, inaugural Dean of the Blavatnik School of Government at Oxford University and Professor of Global Economic Governance will be sharing her latest thoughts on the changing nature of leadership. Reflecting on the crisis that has gripped all regions of the world, Professor Woods will outline what leaders must now deliver and how, not just within countries but also at the global level.

A leading authority on global governance, Professor Woods has advised governments all over the world on issues of globalization, global development and the role of international institutions. As Dean of the Blavatnik School of Government, she places special importance on a global approach to leadership and learning through the examination of practices of government in all countries and regions.

Oxford's Blavatnik School of Government, launched in 2010, aims to be a global school of practice at which future leaders learn, and to which governments, private companies, NGOs and scholars can turn for advice, discussion, evidence and debate. The Blavatnik School's flagship programme, the Master of Public Policy, is an intensive one-year degree course which mixes Oxford's traditional tutorial and lecture methods with master classes taught by external experts, and collaborative learning using state-of-the-art technology. The Walter Kwok Scholarship scheme provides two fully-funded scholarships for Oxford's Master of Public Policy. The aim of the scholarship is to reward university graduates from Hong Kong and China who demonstrate exceptional academic merit.
