
Disciplinary Majors and Minors

Students shall declare at least one of these disciplinary majors in the first semester of their Year 2 studies, and confirm their major(s)/minor(s) by the second last semester of their studies.





Multi-disciplinary Majors and Minors





Major / Minor

Disciplinary Major:

Complete not fewer than **96 credits** of courses including all pre-requisites of that major and the Social Innovation and Global Citizenship (SIGC) requirements

Multi-disciplinary Major:

Complete not fewer than 72 credits of courses in a particular programme including all prerequisites unless otherwise specified

Minor: Complete not fewer than 36 credits of courses in a particular programme including all pre-requisites unless otherwise specified




Majors / Minors options

- Apart from the disciplinary major, students may also opt for double majors or 1-2 minor(s).
- For example,
 - 1 disciplinary major + 1 minor
 - 1 disciplinary major + 2 minors
 - 1 disciplinary major + 1 multi-disciplinary major + 1 minor





Social Innovation

- Credit-bearing, non-paid internship, learning in community
- Required for all BSocSc undergraduates
- Designed to stretch, not primarily vocational

Global Citizenship

- Credit bearing, outside of HK academic experience
- Required for all BSocSc undergraduates
- From 8 weeks to 1 year, many programmes to choose from
 - Overseas internships
 Faculty organised internship and Globalink Research Internship
 - Formal university exchange (1 semester to 1 year)
 3 Campus East Asian Programme is one of these exchange programmes
 - Dual Degree Programme (BSocSc + MA)
 3 years at HKU and 2 years at Geneva
