Professor Timothy Colton is Morris and Anna Feldberg Professor of Government and Russian Studies, and Senior Scholar of Harvard Academy for International and Area Studies at Harvard University. He was a fellow at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, a member of the Joint Committee on Soviet Studies of the Social Science Research Council and the American Council of Learned Societies, and vice-chairman of the National Council for East European, Russian, and Eurasian Research. He is currently a member of the editorial board of *World Politics and Post-Soviet Affairs*.

His research interests are political leadership in post-Communist countries; parties and mass politics in Russia; and the interaction between domestic and international politics in the post-Soviet space.

Professor Colton is the author of a number of books, including *Everyone Loses: The Ukraine Crisis and the Ruinous Contest for Post-Soviet Eurasia*, with Samuel Charap (International Institute for Strategic Studies, 2017), *Russia: What Everyone Needs to Know* (Oxford University Press, 2016), *Yeltsin: A Life* (Basic Books, 2008), *Popular Choice and Managed Democracy: The Russian Elections of 1999 and 2000*, with Michael McFaul (Brookings, 2003), *Transitional Citizens: Voters and What Influences Them in the New Russia* (Harvard University Press, 2000) and *Moscow: Governing the Socialist Metropolis* (Harvard University Press, 1995), which was named best scholarly book in government and political science by the Association of American Publishers.
