Today, the Faculty stands with top social sciences universities in the world. In 2018, we are ranked 4th in Asia and 40th in the world according to the Times Higher Education World University Rankings. In QS World University Ranking 2018, five of our core disciplines, Geography, Politics and Public Administration, Psychology, Social Work & Social Administration and Sociology, have been ranked in top 5 in the Asia respectively.





Employment / Career Prospects

In 2017, 81% of HKU research postgraduates on graduation successfully secured employment and 8.9% of graduates decided to pursue further studies. Education continued to be the largest employment sector for HKU research postgraduates and 67.4% of graduates joined the education sector. In education, "Teaching and Research Profession" was the most popular occupational group (62.6%).

General Qualifications for Admission

The basic qualification necessary for admission to research postgraduate studies is a good honours degree from this University or an equivalent qualification from a comparable institution. Qualifying examinations to test the applicants' abilities to follow the prescribed courses and/or interviews may be conducted.

English Requirement (for applicants holding a first degree from a university where the language of teaching and/or examination is not English) (a) an overall score of 550 or above (paper-based test) or 80 or above (internet-based test) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); or (b) a minimum overall band of 6 with no subtest lower than 5.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (Academic module); or (c) grade C or above in the Overseas General Certificate of Education (GCE), International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), or Cambridge Test of Proficiency in English Language (CPE).
