

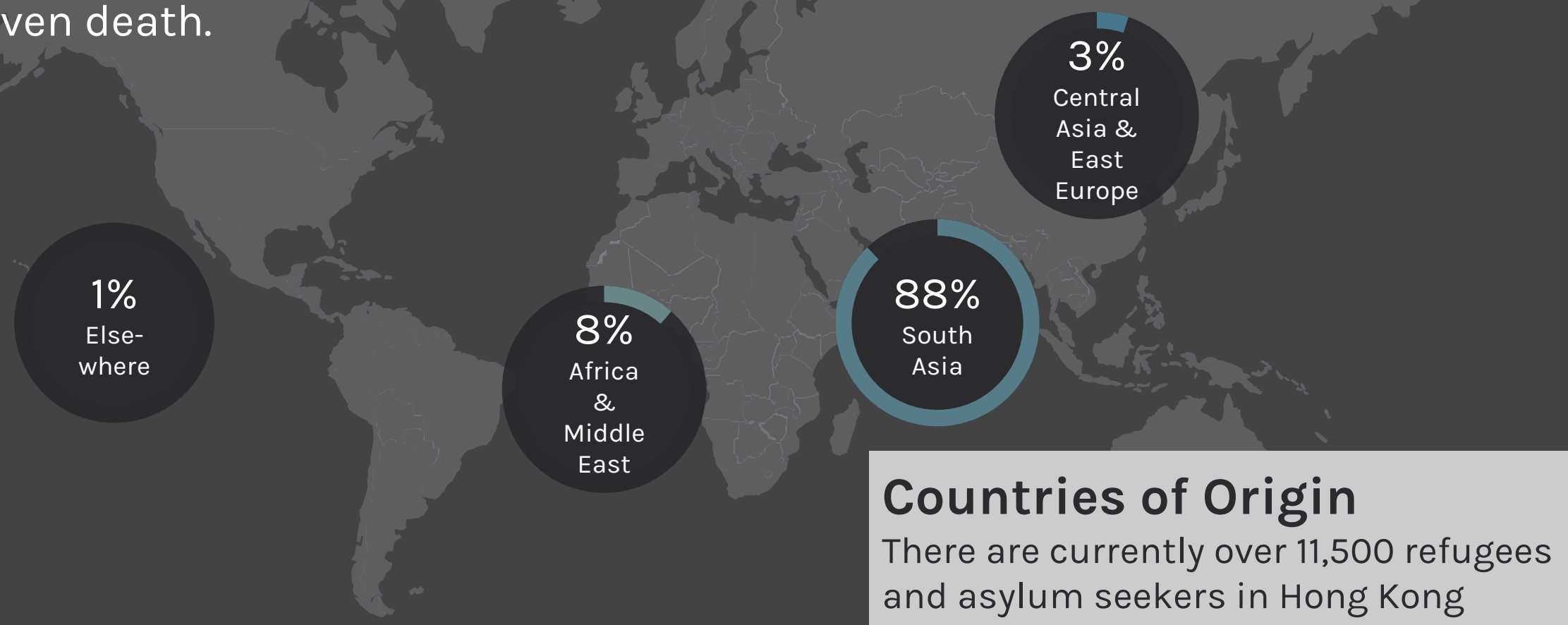

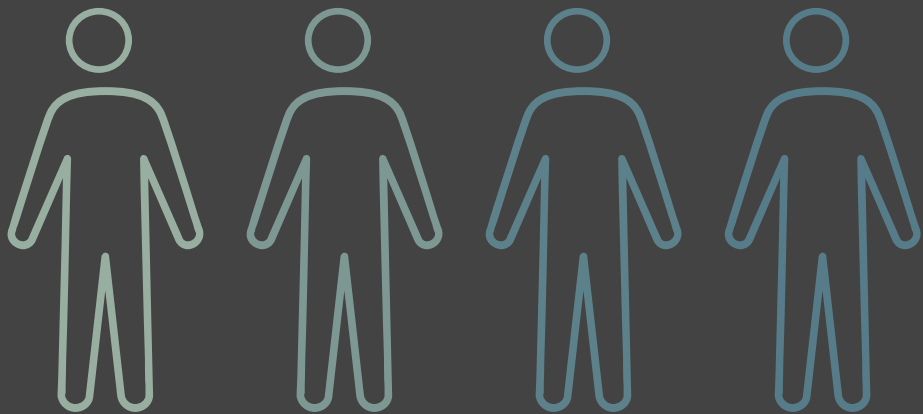


**R** REMEMBER
