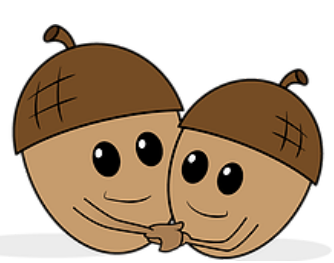
New Research Findings

This seminar will present the findings from research on parents and teachers in a local Hong Kong school with a high rate of children with ASD. It looks at the challenges of effective communication, identify relationship skills, unpack research-based interventions, and most importantly, communicate skills for successful advocacy of ASD children.

Research over 20 years has shown that success with Intervention programs are achieved through a combination of teacher and parent input. This is especially the case with regards to students who have ASD. To attain educational success, effective parent teacher communication is essential.

In circumstances when communication barriers exist, there are significant impacts on student learning. Communication issues can be a result of poor understanding, lack of ASD knowledge, or low confidence and a need for positive intervention. “Effective parent-teacher relationships are best conceived as connections between the two socializing forces in students' lives with the ultimate goal of enhancing their academic, social, behavioural, and emotional development” (Hayes, 2005: p5). For example, any educational strategies such as visual schedules, behaviour management plans, or use of timers can be easily transferred from one setting to the another applying consistency and therefore increased likelihood of progress. More complex interventions will also have an increased achievement when following the same format in both environments.
