GLOBAL DEFINITION OF SOCIAL WORK

Social work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. Underpinned by theories of social work, social sciences, humanities and indigenous knowledge, social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhance wellbeing. The above definition may be amplified at national and/or regional levels. (International Federation of Social Workers, 2014)



The University and the Faculty of Social Sciences provide a wide range of undergraduate exchange programmes with universities all around the world.

Social Work students can undertake half year-exchange opportunities in the second year without extending their studies.

Over 20% of BSW students joined an exchange programme in past 3 years.





3-CAMPUS EAST ASIA PROGRAMME

Participants attend academic lectures relating to three focus areas, namely political, social, and cultural developments in Taiwan and South Korea to examine these areas through a comparative lens as well as analyzing their regional and global implications.





SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

ACADEMIC ADVISING

- To assist students' adjustment to university life academically and socially,
- a Faculty Academic Adviser from the home Faculty is assigned upon admission to HKU;
- a Personal Tutor from the home Department is assigned each year from the second year of study onwards.

Our HKU Social Work Alumni Association offers a one-to-one Mentorship scheme to provide support and guidance to current social work students and new graduates.

- Applicants are usually invited to interview once from May to June.
