
What is an age-friendly city?

- An age-friendly city is an inclusive and accessible urban environment that promotes active ageing.
- Active ageing is the process of optimizing opportunities for health, participation and security in order to enhance quality of life as people age.

Guidelines for an age-friendly city: Eight domains


- 1. Outdoor spaces and buildings
- 2. Transportation
- 3. Housing
- 4. Social participation
- 5. Respect and social inclusion
- 6. Civic participation and employment
- 7. Communication and information
- 8. Community support and health services

- Echo to Age-friendly city of WHO


Purposes

- To encourage social participation: set up the learning centers/places in urban & township
- To enhance quality of life: planning learning activities/courses for seniors

Purposes (con't)

 To be respected and productive: to enlarge senior's power and provide a platform for them

 Access active aging information : to encourage exchange among centers



Current Status


Active aging Learning centers: 202 (2008-2010)

Courses: Basic course – 5,505 hr
 Interest course – 10,078 hr
 Contributive course –2,201 hr
 Transcendent course – 193hr

Volunteers: 6,437 person

Participation: 29,495 person (female,74%; male, 26%)


