Biography

Professor Lee, currently an Associate Vice-President of The University of Hong Kong, is the Chair Professor of Psychological Science and Clinical Psychology and May Endowed Professor in Neuropsychology. Professor Lee's research is at the frontiers of neuropsychology and human neuroscience. Her current research focuses on the neuroplastic underpinnings of brain and psychological health, especially applicable for older people. She has published over 270 articles in Molecular Psychiatry, Ebiomedicine, Neuroscience and Biobehavioral Review, and other high impact journals. Professor Lee pioneers the development Chinese norms of neuropsychological tests, which are an essential guide for clinical practice. She is an invited Associate Editor of The SAGE Handbook of Clinical Neuropsychology and The Elsevier Encyclopaedia of Behavioural Neuroscience, 2nd Edition.

Professor Lee's research and clinical achievements are recognised internationally. She is a Visiting Professor at King's College London. She is an elected fellow of learned societies, including the American Psychological Association (Society of Clinical Psychology and Society of Clinical Neuropsychology), Association for Psychological Science (Clinical Psychology), and the American College of Professional Neuropsychology. She serves as an Associate Editor of "Neuroscience and Biobehavioral Reviews", "Biological Psychiatry: GOS. She also serves as an Editorial Board member of many influential journals that publish data-guiding research and practice of clinical psychology/neuropsychology and human neuroscience. Professor Lee has received numerous awards in recognition of her excellence in teaching, clinical work, and research, including the State Scientific and Technology Profess National Award (2nd Class), the National Education Bureau's Research Output Prize (2nd Class), and the Hong Kong Research Grant Council Prestigious Fellowship.
