Professor Mark Wang is Director of Centre for Contemporary Chinese Studies at The University of Melbourne. He is a development geographer. He is also a professor in School of Geography, Earth and Atmospheric Sciences. He was awarded a Bachelor of Science at Shanxi Normal University in 1982. In 1985 he completed a Master of Science in Northeast Institute of Geography & Agro-Ecology, Chinese Academy of Sciences and in 1995 he attained a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of British Columbia.

Professor Wang's recent research projects include Chinese infrastructural investment in Indonesia, poverty alleviation resettlement, land acquisition, and South-to-North water diversion issues in China. He has published extensively on these topics. He received Australian International Medal in 2018.
