Biography

Dr Christian Greiffenhagen is an Associate Professor of Sociology in the Department of Applied Social Sciences of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU). Before joining PolyU, Dr Greiffenhagen was Associate Professor at the Department of Sociology at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Senior Lecturer at the Department of Social Sciences at Loughborough University, and a British Academy Postdoctoral Fellow at the Department of Sociology at The University of Manchester. He holds a PhD in Social Science and Computer Science, an MSc in Educational Research Methodology, and an MSc in Mathematical Foundations of Computer Science from University of Oxford.

Dr Greiffenhagen's primary research areas are in Science and Technology Studies (STS) and Human-Computer Interaction (HCI). As a sociologist with a background in computer science, Dr Greiffenhagen uses innovative methods (in particular video-based ethnography) to understand how new scientific developments and digital technologies are transforming our work, learning, and everyday practices. His works are published in prominent journals including *Sociology*, *Journal of Computer-Supported Cooperative Work*, *Symbolic Interaction* and *Journal of Pragmatics*.
