Biography

Professor Cameron Campbell is a Chair Professor in the Division of Social Science at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. He was a Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford 2022-23. From 2020 to 2023, he was a Distinguished Professor in the School of History and Culture at Central China Normal University. He was a Guggenheim Fellow in 2004 and a Changjiang Scholar at Central China Normal University from 2017 to 2020. He was Professor in the Department of Sociology at UCLA and an affiliate of the California Center for Population Research (CCPR) at UCLA.

Professor Campbell's research focuses on stratification and inequality, especially in China and in comparative perspective. He continues research on kinship, inequality, and demographic behavior in China and in comparative perspective using large multi-generational population databases, most notably the China Multigenerational Panel Datasets (CMGPD). In connection with this, he has published on a wide variety of related topics, including economic, family and social influences on demographic outcomes such as birth, marriage, migration, and death, fertility limitation in historical China, and the role of kin networks in shaping social mobility. Related books were published by MIT Press and Cambridge University Press. His papers have appeared in prominent journals such as *American Journal of Sociology, American Sociological Review, Demography, Population Studies*, and *Demographic Research*.
