Senhu Wang is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology and Anthropology at the National University of Singapore (NUS). He earned his PhD in Sociology from the University of Cambridge. His research primarily explores the dynamics of work and family, health and wellbeing, demography, and quantitative research methods. The central goal of Professor Senhu Wang's current research is to examine the evolving relationship between work and family and its impact on various individual and societal outcomes, including health and wellbeing, family formation, gender inequalities and labour market opportunities. He has published over 50 articles in numerous top international journals (e.g., PNAS, Demography, Social Forces, British Journal of Sociology). His work has garnered extensive citations and significant media coverage worldwide by over 100 organizations, including the BBC, CNN, Financial Times, The Guardian, and Bloomberg.
