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Biography

Nuntnidhi Bongsebodhidhamma is a Thai researcher specialising in enactive and co-creative approaches to participatory urban governance. A PhD candidate in Social Sciences at Waseda University, she holds an MSc in International Development from the LSE (2012), an MPP from the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies—GRIPS (2009), and a BSc in Political Science from Chulalongkorn University (2007). Her doctoral study, “Mapping Meaning and Linking Networks”, explores how embodied planning can foster environmental symbiosis and strengthen the Social Solidarity Economy (SSE) in Asia’s secondary cities. Integrating LEGO® Serious Play® with futuring methods, her research develops frameworks that transform local narratives and tacit knowledge into adaptive governance systems. Before pursuing her PhD, she served as a full-time lecturer at Phranakhon Rajabhat University (2016–2021) under the Royal Thai scholarship scheme, where she led civic engagement and public policy education. Her work aims to bridge community wisdom and institutional design towards regenerative and inclusive urban futures.
