Professor Elizabeth J Perry is Director of the Harvard-Yenching Institute and Henry Rosovsky Professor of Government at Harvard University. She holds a PhD from the University of Michigan and is a former President of the Association for Asian Studies and former Director of Harvard's Fairbank Centre for Chinese Studies. Her research focuses on the history of the Chinese revolution and its implications for contemporary Chinese politics. A fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and a corresponding fellow of the British Academy.

Professor Perry is the author or editor of more than 20 books including, most recently, *Mao's Invisible Hand: The Political Foundations of Adaptive Governance in China* (Harvard, 2011); *Anyuan: Mining China's Revolutionary Tradition* (California, 2012); *What is the Best Kind of History?* (Zhejiang, 2015); and *Beyond Regimes: China and India Compared* (Harvard, 2018). Her book, *Shanghai on Strike: The Politics of Chinese Labor* (Standard, 1993) received the John King Fairbank Prize of the American Historical Association; her article, "Chinese Conceptions of Rights": *From Mencius to Mao – and Now*" (Perspectives on Politics, 2008) and received the Heinz I. Eulau Prize of the American Political Science Association.
