## **Biography**

Dr. WC Chang is a clinical assistant professor at the Department of Psychiatry, an Associate member of the State Key Laboratory of Brain & Cognitive Sciences, The University of Hong Kong, and an honorary associate consultant at the Department of Psychiatry, Queen Mary Hospital. He is a Member of the Royal College of Psychiatrists (UK) and a Fellow of the Hong Kong College of Psychiatrists. His research focuses include early intervention for psychosis, negative symptoms, and clinical high-risk for psychosis. He has published over 80 full-length articles in international peer-reviewed journals (including 30 first-authored and/or corresponding-authored articles) such as Schizophrenia Bulletin, British Journal of Psychiatry, Psychological Medicine, Journal of Clinical Psychiatry, Schizophrenia Research and 3 book chapters. He has received several research awards over the past few years including Clinical Research Fellowship of HK Research Grants Council in 2014, Distinguished Young Fellow (HK Academy of Medicine) in 2014, IEPA (International Early Psychosis Association) Young Investigator Award, and NARSAD (National

Alliance for Research on Schizophrenia and Depression) Young Investigator Award by Brain and Behavior Research Foundation of United States in 2016.
