Exchange and Graduation



Students are strongly recommended to join exchange in Year 2-3.

Students joining exchange in their **final year** might result in any of the following consequences:



Grades are normally released in early-September. Request for early grade release will NOT be entertained



Students will be <u>unable</u> to graduate from the Bachelor's Degree by the end of August. Any postgraduate studies to be commenced in September might be affected. Any offer of postgraduate studies might be cancelled in the worst case



Official documents reflecting students' completion of the Bachelor's Degree, e.g. transcript, Certificate of Graduation (CoG), AAP, etc. will only available for application after the official graduation date by mid-September



Students are **ONLY** eligible to join the Winter Congregation



Any strike(s) in the European countries may lead to delay in transcript issuing



Core/Compulsory courses in Year 3-4

- Might NOT be offered in Host University during your exchange semester
- Might ONLY be offered in certain semester in HKU, when you are on exchange * Students are recommended to check carefully prior to your exchange study

Global Citizenship (GC)

Exchange Programme is one of the various options to fulfil the 12-credit Global Citizenship (GC) requirement

- √ Faculty-level Exchange Programmes
- V HKUWW Exchange Programmes
- √ Short-term Study Abroad Programmes (course-based) organised by International Affairs
 Office (IAO)

During your Exchange, Global Citizenship (GC) requirement should be the <u>priority</u> of your credit transfer, to fulfil GC requirement with credits earned from Exchange Programmes, you must:

- Apply for credit transfer with 12 HKU-equivalent credits of advanced level courses (course level determined by HKU) prior to your exchange study, excluding APRU
- √ Advanced level recognized by HKU units
- √ At least 12 HKU-equivalent credits

- √ Can be of any fields
- excluding APRU and all virtual learning
- **✗** Local Universities



Credits from virtual exchange programmes, e.g. APRU, cannot be used to fulfil the GC requirement



Exchange Programme itself is not necessarily able to suffice the GC requirement

Global Citizenship (GC)

During your Exchange, Global Citizenship (GC) requirement should be the priority of your credit transfer



Advanced level recognized by HKU units

➤ Course that are advanced level in Host University might sometime be recognised as introductory level in HKU



At least 12 HKU-equivalent credits

- ➤ 1 course can only have 1 fulfilment, if the course is only worth 10 HKU credits, then you will need 2 courses to fulfil GC (Scenario 2)
- ➤ If the course is worth 2 HKU credits, then you would need 6 courses to fulfil GC



Can be of any field

➤ Students of social sciences are, however, recommended to enrol in courses which are related to their major(s). Courses in non-social sciences field may sometimes be challenging, despite such courses are potentially regarded as introductory level

Failure to credit transfer

During your Exchange, some traps that might lead to unsuccessful credit transfer:



Failure in the course(s) taken at Exchange Host University

➤ If you have failed the course(s) taken at the Host University, then NO credits shall be gained for the particular course(s)



Course(s) that you have taken in HKU previously

- ➤ If a course is mapped to be equivalent to a HKU course you already fulfilled, then such course could not be taken again for credit transfer
- ➤ If a course you completed at the Host University is mapped to be equivalent to a HKU course which you have not fulfilled yet, it would be eligible for credit transfer but this course could not be taken again at HKU



Courses of recreational field

Watch for fields that not taught in HKU. For example, if the course(s) is of recreational fields, it would most likely be recognised as introductory level

The fail course(s), or otherwise, will not show up on your HKU transcript.

Credit Transfer Rule - Multiples of 6

Credit Conversion

• The total number of credits for a semester or year of exchange study must only in multiples of 6 credits even though transfer credits awarded for individual courses need not follow the standard 6-credit HKU course requirement. The credit adjustment (downward or upward) in the Faculty of Social Sciences will be made for one course on the following course priority under normal circumstances:

Free elective -> Global Citizenship -> Minor's disciplinary elective -> Major's disciplinary elective

Credits Requirement for Graduation:

Courses	No. of Required Credits
Introductory courses	Not more than 108 credits*
Advanced courses	Not fewer than 132 credits
Total no. of credits	Not fewer than 240 credits

Almost all of the 1000-level courses are introductory level.

- if you enrol in more than 108 credits of introductory courses;
- enrol in any introductory courses in the final year of study.
- The extra introductory credits will be counted on top of the normal study load of 240 credits.
- In other words, students who have taken more than 108 introductory credits are required to take more than 240 credits for graduation.
