- The Faculty will review all registrations. If you register for a workshop that is already full, the Faculty will contact you to make alternative arrangements. If you do not hear from the Faculty within **two working days** after registration, you may assume that your enrolment is successful. If the Faculty does not receive your response after following up with you, the Faculty may make alternative arrangements on your behalf.
- Upon successful enrolment, a confirmation email with the venue information or Zoom details will be sent to you **one working day before the event**.
- If you are unable to attend a workshop for which you have registered, you must notify the Faculty by email at socii@hku.hk, provide a justification, and apply for leave of absence. A make-up assignment will be sent to you to make up for your absence.
- Failure to complete **any** of the following requirements will result in a 5% mark deduction in the overall grade point of the course:

 - completing the self-assessment form for readiness, or
